Sponsored by the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, the essay contest serves to celebrate and increase awareness of the numerous contributions made by Florida women serving in public office.

Celebrating Florida women who have served and who are currently serving in public office presents the opportunity to honor and recount stories of our ancestors' talents, sacrifices, and commitments and inspires today's generations. Learning about our past allows us to build our future.

Focus of Essay

A legislator is a person who writes and passes laws. Legislators are public servants and are often elected by the people of the state. You have just been elected to public office. Which office would that be? What issue would you like to champion and why? Use female Florida legislators, past or present, as your inspiration.

Rules:

- Essays must be received by 5:00 pm on ~~December 15, 2017~~. **Good news! In order to accommodate the challenging schedule posed on Florida by the storms of this Fall, the Florida Commission on the Status of Women has extended the deadline for the 2018 Essay Contest to Friday, January 12, 2018. It is the desire of the Commission for all Florida Middle School students to have the opportunity to participate.** Winners will be announced in January 2018.
- Each contestant must be a legal resident of Florida at the time of submission. All Florida students in grades 6 through 8 (public, private and home-schooled) are eligible.
- Awards will be made in three categories: 6th grade, 7th grade, and 8th grade.
- Only an individual student may submit an essay; no groups.
- Essays must be written in paragraph format, be between 250 and 500 words, typed using 12-point font, and double-spaced, with margins set to at least one inch on all sides. Please

select a legible font, such as Times New Roman or Arial.

- Essays should have a title. The title should be at the top of the first page.
- **Do not** put your name on the essay. Your name should appear on the entry form only.
- Submissions must include completed official Entry Form and Release Statement.
- Essays may be submitted via e-mail to essay@fcsw.net (use subject line: FCSW Essay Contest.) Essays submitted via e-mail must be in .doc or .pdf format and sent as an attachment. Essays received via e-mail will be confirmed by e-mail within two business days. If a receipt is not received, please call 850-414-3531.

- All entries are the property of the Florida Commission on the Status of Women. The decision of the judges and the Commission is final.

Awards

Awards will be given to the first and second place winner in each of the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade categories. **First place: \$100; second place: \$75.**

All winners will be honored and asked to read their essay in a ceremony at the Florida Capitol during the 2018 Florida Legislative Education Summit at the Capitol in February 2018. Teachers will also be recognized. Winning essays will be published on the Florida Commission on the Status of Women's website during March in recognition of Women's History Month.

Criteria for Judging Essays

- Theme must be clearly addressed.
- Responses should be creative and include information based on knowledge of female members of the Florida Legislature and their contributions to the state and nation.
- Content must include relevant, authentic information and ideas must be fully developed, and must demonstrate critical and creative thinking.
- Proper grammar, spelling and punctuation must be consistent with accepted usage. **Please proofread your essay prior to submitting!** Engaging a teacher or other adult for review and feedback is encouraged.
