PURPOSE

To commemorate and honor women's history and members of the Florida Women's Hall of Fame



Sponsored by the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, the Florida Women's History essay contest is open to both boys and girls and serves to celebrate women's history and to increase awareness of the contributions made by Florida women, past and present. Celebrating women's history presents the opportunity to honor and recount stories of our ancestors' talents, sacrifices, and commitments and inspires today's generations. Learning about our past allows us to build our future.

"No person in the United States shall on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any educational program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

It was 50 years ago that Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 was passed into law. These 37 words served as the groundwork to open the door of opportunity for girls, especially in sports. It took years after the passage of the law for it to begin to take hold, but it eventually led to the rise of collegiate women's athletic programs and professional leagues. Women are now making sports history, not just through their careers, but by being pioneers and breaking the glass ceiling, serving as an inspiration and paving the way for other women to follow in their footsteps.

Prompt: Since Title IX was passed 50 years ago, we have seen growth and an increase in opportunities for girls and women in sports. "Who is your favorite female athlete or sports pioneer and why do they inspire you?"

RULES



- Essays must be received by 5:00 pm on March 3, 2023. It is the desire of the Commission for all Florida Middle School students to have the opportunity to participate. Winners will be announced in March 2023.
- Each contestant must be a legal resident of Florida at the time of submission. All Florida students in grades 6 through 8 (public, private, and home-schooled) are eligible.
- Awards will be made in three categories: 6th, 7th, and 8th grade.
- Essays should have a title. The title should be at the top of the first page.
- Essays must be written in paragraph format, be between 250 and 500 words, typed using 12 point font, and double-spaced with margins set to at least one inch on all sides. Please select a legible font, such as Times New Roman. Essays must be the original work of the student.
- Do not put your name on the essay; your name should appear on the entry form only.
- Submissions must include a completed official Entry Form and Release Statement.
- Essays may be submitted via e-mail to essay@fcsw.net (use subject line: FCSW Essay Contest.) Essays received via e-mail will be confirmed by e-mail within two business days. If a receipt is not received, please call Kim Mehr at 850-414-3531.
- All entries are the property of the Florida Commission on the Status of Women. The decision of the judges and the Commission is final.

AWARDS & CRITERIA



Awards will be given to the first and second place winner in each of the 6th, 7th, and 8th-grade categories. **First Place: \$100; second place: \$75**. All winners and their teachers will be recognized during a special ceremony. Winning essays will be published on the FCSW website during March in recognition of Women's History Month.

Criteria for Judging Essays

- The theme must be clearly addressed.
- Responses should be creative.
- Content must include relevant, authentic information and ideas must be fully developed and must demonstrate critical and creative thinking.
- Proper grammar, spelling, and punctuation must be consistent with accepted usage. **Please proofread your** essay prior to submitting! Engaging a teacher or other adult for review and feedback is encouraged.
