PURPOSE

To commemorate and honor women's history and members of the Florida Women's Hall of Fame



Sponsored by the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, the Florida Women's History art contest is open to both boys and girls and serves to celebrate women's history and increase awareness of the contributions made by Florida women, past and present. Celebrating women's history presents the opportunity to honor and recount stories of our ancestors' talents, sacrifices, and commitments, and inspires today's generations. Learning about our past allows us to build our future.

THEME

2024

PUBLIC SERVICE takes many forms, driven by the goal of helping others. Public servants may be involved in:

- · Government (local, state, and federal employees and elected officials);
- Public safety (firefighters, police officers, paramedics, civilian and military people, astronauts);
- Public health (doctors, nurses, caregivers, and administrators);
- Public works (engineers, conservationists, bus drivers, park rangers, lifeguards);
- Public education (teachers, librarians, scientists, researchers, and administrators);
- Community support (providing support and assistance to community members who are in crisis, homeless or hungry typically through volunteerism and not-for-profit organizations);
- \cdot Any person who serves their community for the public good.

RULES



- Entries must be mailed to the Florida Commission on the Status of Women and must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on February 29, 2024.
- Emailed or faxed entries will not be accepted. Contestants are responsible for all shipping costs.
- Each contestant must be a legal resident of Florida at the time of submission. All Florida students in grades K through 5 (public, private, and home-schooled) are eligible.
- Students must provide all required information requested on the entry form and the entry form must be legible. The student and parent/legal guardian are required to read and understand these rules in order to submit the entry form in its entirety. The entry form includes a release and certification that must be signed by a parent or guardian.
- Each submission must have the entry form attached. A copy of the completed entry form must also be attached to the back of the artwork.
- Each applicant and his/her parent or guardian must agree to give all rights to the submitted artwork, including copyright, to the Florida Commission on the Status of Women. This transfer of rights will allow the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, at a minimum, to reproduce, distribute, and display your artwork.
- The winner's submission will be duplicated in various mediums and used to promote Women's History Month throughout the state. This means that when you submit your artwork to participate in this contest, your artwork will become the property of the State of Florida and will not be returned.

CRITERIA



All winners and their teachers will be recognized with a certificate during a special ceremony. Winning art will be published on the FCSW website during March in recognition of Women's History Month.

Artwork: Student must submit original, two-dimensional artwork.

1. Student artwork must be original and created by only the student. Artwork **may not** be drawn from any existing artwork (photograph, advertisement, etc.) not created by the student.

2. Student artwork must measure $8\frac{1}{2}$ " by 11" and be created using any two-dimensional medium including:

- a. drawing (pencil, ink, crayon, graphite, etc.)
- b.painting (pastel, watercolor, spray paint, oils, etc.)
- 3. Each student may enter only one submission to this contest.
