PURPOSE

To commemorate and honor women's history and members of the Florida Women's Hall of Fame



Sponsored by the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, the Florida Women's History art contest is open to both boys and girls and serves to celebrate women's history and increase awareness of the contributions made by Florida women, past and present. Celebrating women's history presents the opportunity to honor and recount stories of our ancestors' talents, sacrifices, and commitments, and inspires today's generations. Learning about our past allows us to build our future.

THEME

2025

Innovation is about coming up with new ideas, methods, or solutions that improve something or solve a problem in a creative way. Innovation might involve thinking outside the box to approach a project differently, explore a unique angle, or find a new way of presenting findings. It's not just about inventing something entirely new—sometimes it's simply about improving or rethinking an existing idea to make it more effective or interesting. Encourage the artist to be curious, ask questions, and explore different possibilities that will help them bring innovative thinking to their project.

Create an art piece inspired by this year's theme, "Florida Women Who Drive Innovation"

RULES



- Entries must be mailed to the Florida Commission on the Status of Women and must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on March 31, 2025.
- Emailed or faxed entries will not be accepted. Contestants are responsible for all shipping costs.
- Each contestant must be a legal resident of Florida at the time of submission.
 All Florida students in grades K through 5 (public, private, and home-schooled) are eligible.
- Students must provide all required information requested on the entry form and the entry form must be legible. The student and parent/legal guardian are required to read and understand these rules in order to submit the entry form in its entirety. The entry form includes a release and certification that must be signed by a parent or guardian.
- Each submission must have the entry form attached. A copy of the completed entry form must also be attached to the back of the artwork.
- Each applicant and his/her parent or guardian must agree to give all rights to the submitted artwork, including copyright, to the Florida Commission on the Status of Women. This transfer of rights will allow the Florida Commission on the Status of Women, at a minimum, to reproduce, distribute, and display your artwork.
- The winner's submission will be duplicated in various mediums and used to promote Women's History Month throughout the state. This means that when you submit your artwork to participate in this contest, your artwork will become the property of the State of Florida and will not be returned.

All winners and their teachers will be recognized with a certificate during a special ceremony. Winning art will be published on the FCSW website.

Artwork: Student must submit original, two-dimensional artwork.

- 1. Student artwork must be original and created by only the student. Artwork **may not** be drawn from any existing artwork (photograph, advertisement, etc.) not created by the student.
- 2. Student artwork must measure $8\frac{1}{2}$ " by 11" and be created using any two-dimensional medium including:
 - a. drawing (pencil, ink, crayon, graphite, etc.)
 - b. painting (pastel, watercolor, spray paint, oils, etc.)
- 3. Each student may enter only one submission to this contest.
